- Register @ SAM.Gov as WOSB or EDWOSB
- Get a DUNS number

Is my business "woman owned"?



- **51**%
- Unconditionally and directly
- Owned and controlled
- By one or more women
- Who are U. S. citizens

Is my business economically disadvantaged?

■ Total assets < \$6 million

■ Net worth < \$750,000

■ Personal income < \$350,000

Self Certification

- Gather the necessary documents
 - Birth certificate or passport of owner(s)
 - Articles of incorporation
 - By-laws and amendments of company
 - Stock certificates, ledger, voting agreements (if applicable)
 - Assumed name certifications (if applicable)
 - Joint venture agreements (if applicable)



Self Certification



Go to certify.sba.gov

Create an account, upload documents

No updates required unless there is a "material change"

 Documents uploaded to SBA stay with your profile and can be used for other programs

Third Party Certification

- Four approved certifiers:
 - National Women's Business Owners Corporation (NWBOC)
 - Women's Enterprise National Council (WBENC)
 - U.S. Women's Chamber of Commerce (USWCC)
 - El Paso Hispanic Chamber of Commerce (EPHCC)
